## Steps to follow for persons with travel history

What to do if, during the last 14 days, you have arrived from an area affected by the outbreak of an epidemic caused by the novel coronavirus (central China, Hubei province, Wuhan and others, according to the current epidemiological situation), or you have changed flights in major Asian international airports and have no symptoms of the disease:

For the entire duration of the maximum incubation period, i.e. for 14 days after you have left the infected area, stay at home, if possible, and minimize contact with other people.

Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use disinfectants containing at least 70% alcohol.

Call the anti-epidemic department of the locally competent Regional Public Health Authority, which shall decide on suitable anti-epidemic measures to be adopted, including a quarantine, if appropriate

Your general practitioner will issue you with a confirmation evidencing that you have been put in quarantine, if required.

If you experience symptoms such as a subfebrile-febrile temperature, cough, shortness of breath, contact the local infectious disease clinic by phone.

If you have been requested to undergo a medical examination at an infectious disease clinic, do not travel by public transport. If possible, wear a protective face mask, enter the waiting room only after being permitted to do so by the staff of the infectious disease clinic.

What to do if, during the last 14 days, you have arrived from an area affected by the outbreak of an epidemic caused by the novel coronavirus (central China, Hubei province, Wuhan and others, according to the current epidemiological situation), or you have changed flights in major Asian international airports and have a fever, cough or suffer from shortness of breath:

If you are at home, do not go anywhere – avoid contact with other people.

Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use disinfectants containing at least 70% alcohol.

When coughing and sneezing, cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or with your arm or sleeve, not with your hands!!!

Contact the local infectious disease clinic by phone.

If you have been requested to undergo a medical examination at an infectious disease clinic, do not travel by public transport. If possible, wear a protective face mask, enter the waiting room only after being permitted to do so by the staff of the infectious disease clinic.
