Appendix No. 2: Testing Methodology Applicable to TBU Students:

What does the a/b/c CONFIRMATION mean?

- a) an original copy of a confirmation issued by a laboratory and evidencing that you have already had the COVID-19 disease, isolation period has expired in accordance with the extraordinary measure issued by the Ministry of Health and currently in force, you show no symptoms of the COVID-19 disease, and no more than 90 days have passed since the first positive RT-PCR test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus or since the POC test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen, or
- b) an original copy of a certificate issued by the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic on the vaccination against COVID-19, provided that no less than 14 days have elapsed since the second dose of vaccine was administered in the case of a two-dose regimen according to the Summary of Medicinal Product Characteristics (hereinafter referred to as "SPC"), or no less than 14 days have elapsed since the first dose of vaccine was administered in the case of a single-dose regimen according to the SPC, or
- c) an original copy of the POC test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or an RT-PCR test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus with a negative result, which **must not be older than 48 hours and must be carried out by a healthcare service provider** in accordance with the extraordinary measure issued by the Ministry of Health in connection with the testing and currently in force.

1. I am in the Halls of Residence/I want to get accommodation. What should I do?


Am I physically present in the TBU Residence Halls before 24 April 2021?



You have to undergo testing on Saturday 24 April (you will be informed about the place and time) or present an original copy of the a/b/c CONFIRMATION to the receptionist.



If you intend to stay in the TBU Residence Halls also in the following weeks and your a/b/c CONFIRMATION is no longer valid, you have to get tested during the given working days offered in the booking system. The validity period of an internal confirmation of a negative test result issued by TBU is 7 days, therefore, you have to register for another test time in a timely manner, if you intend to stay in the TBU Residence Halls.



Do I want to get accommodation starting from 24 April or am I returning back to the Residence Hall?



You have to arrive with an original copy of the a/b/c CONFIRMATION or get yourself tested on the given dates offered in the booking system. The validity period of an internal confirmation of a negative test result issued by TBU is 7 days. You are expected to present this confirmation at the reception desk of TBU.





Carry the original copy of the confirmation of a negative test result issued by TBU or the a/b/c confirmation with you all the times when moving through the premises of TBU!

2. I intend to go to the Faculty (only to the extent specified in the relevant Rector's Decree).


Do I have a valid a/b/c CONFIRMATION or an internal confirmation issued by TBU to present at the reception to gain entry to the building of the Faculty?



Present an original copy of a valid a/b/c CONFIRMATION or an internal confirmation of a negative test result issued by TBU.



If you intend to come to the Faculty on a regular basis, do not postpone your registration in the booking system and get yourself regularly tested at TBU. The validity period of the confirmation issued by TBU is 7 days.



Register for a test time in the TBU booking system (validity period of an internal confirmation of a negative test result is 7 days) or in a medical facility (Do not forget to require a confirmation, which is valid for 48 hours only!)

The frequency of testing is once per 7 days!



You must undergo a screening test before attending classes. You will be allowed to enter a TBU building only with a valid confirmation of a negative test result.



Carry the original copy of the confirmation of a negative test result issued by TBU or the a/b/c confirmation with you all the times when moving through the premises of TBU!

3. My test result is positive. What should I do?

- 1) You will receive a confirmation of the positive result.
- 2) You are obliged to leave the premises of TBU, including the premises of the TBU Halls of Residence without delay, unless you have your place of residence here.
- 3) You are obliged to undergo a confirmatory RT-PCR test for the presence of the SARS CoV-2 virus.
- 4) You are obliged to inform the relevant Student Affair Office of the Faculty and, in the event that you are a resident of the TBU Residence Halls, also the Halls of Residence and Refectory.

Testing Methodology Applicable to TBU Students:

- This procedure does not apply to students who provide the confirmation referred to in Article 7 Paragraph 1 of this Decree.
- Confirmation issued by a healthcare service provider or an internal TBU confirmation of a negative test result is valid for 7 days.
- A student can undergo an antigen test carried out at TBU by a healthcare service provider shall book a test time on the website https:\\COVID-STUDENT.UTB.CZ
- Screening testing shall be carried out from 24 April 2021 onwards. A screening test shall be carried out once per 7 days. The first test shall be carried out on the first day when the student is present at classes in person. The screening test shall be always carried out before the start of classes. If a student is not present on the testing day, he/she shall be tested on the day and time defined by Halls of Residence of TBU in Zlín.
- A student accommodated in a university accommodation facility is obliged to undergo a test upon arrival at the accommodation facility in the event that he/she is present there in person earlier than he/she is present at classes held at the University.
- If the result of an antigen screening test is positive, the University will provide the student with a confirmation of the positive result. If the test result is positive, the student is obliged to leave the premises of the University or of another place where classes are held as well as the premises of the university accommodation facility without delay; if not otherwise possible, the student does not have to leave the accommodation facility. The student is obliged to inform the healthcare service provider in the field of general medicine about the positive test result by phone or using other common remote communication tools.
- The student is obliged to inform the University about a positive test result after receiving information that the confirmatory test result is positive as well.
- In the event of a positive test result, the University shall immediately contact the locally competent Regional Public Health Authority and provide it with all cooperation necessary.
- The healthcare service provider in the field of general medicine is obliged to take a decision as to whether to carry out a confirmatory test using the RT-PCR method and is also required to complete an electronic application for such a confirmatory test if receiving information of a positive result of an antigen screening test carried out by a person himself/herself or by another person.
- All persons who have had a positive result of an antigen screening test are required to take a confirmatory RT-PCR test for the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus.
- In the case of screening testing carried out by a healthcare service provider, extraordinary measures adopted by the Ministry of Health and relating to antigen testing of residents and to the quarantine and isolation policy apply similarly.
- If a student who is not allowed to be present at classes in person in accordance with another extraordinary measure or a student who does not participate at classes in person during a period of 7 days is accommodated in a university accommodation facility, such a student is required to undergo a screening test carried out in the accommodation facility or at the University.
